STORY EXTENSION IDEAS

- Help your child cut different colored squares out of construction paper. Let them lay them out on a large rectangle piece of paper (or papers taped together) to make a quilt. Glue them down when the pattern is complete.
- Play this chase and tag game. Have one member of the family be Baby Llama. Baby Llama is "it" and hides his or her eyes while other family members line up all at an equal distance from Baby Llama. With the eyes still closed Baby Llama says, "Llama, Llama, RED Pajama!" and anyone wearing red has to take a step closer to Baby Llama. This continues as Baby Llama replaces red with other colors and the players quietly creep closer and closer. Whenever the child pretending to be Baby Llama wishes he or she may decide to look and shout, "Mama! Mama!" while beginning to chase the players. The first one tagged is the new Baby Llama.
